This show will shine a spotlight on the animals of the Okanagan from the perspective of the Sylix people. Curated by Cori Derrickson:smqwmqwtalqs, Sqilw Artist of the Okanagan Nation, with new orchestrations by Summerland composer Anita Perry, Tmixw will celebrate the land and the animals of the Okanagan using music,

drama, dance and storytelling with a focus on Nsyilxcən, the traditional language of the Sylix people of the Okanagan. Okanagan students and professional performers will share the stage with the OSO as we celebrate this rich heritage.
