<u>Information Regarding Student</u> <u>Placement for 2019-2020</u>

Placement of students in classes is dependent upon a number of considerations. We will have our placement meeting in mid-June. Our school is likely going to have 17 divisions.

For the first time in many years we will NOT have 'straight' grade classes. Most of our classes will be a mix of grades and combinations. This is actually the norm in most schools, most years.

In placing students the following considerations are taken into account:

Class composition including special needs/requirements
Social/cultural issues (independence, interactions, leadership)
Behavioural/social issues
Diversity in development
(academic,social,emotional)

Middle Priority

Groupings in previous years
Dominant grade composition
Physical/social maturation
Learner style
Siblings and relations

<u>Lower Priority</u>

Friendships

Teacher-learner compatibility
Class size (room to accommodate new students)
