Treasurer's Report The **general account** balance is \$32,138.03; minus funds being held for the outdoor classroom, Askews' gift cards, and previously approved spending, the adjusted balance is \$16,338.03. The **lunch account** balance is \$7,959.86; minus funds being held, the adjusted balance is **\$5,959.86**. The gaming account balance is \$10,155.75; minus funds being held for previously approved spending, the adjusted balance is \$2,555.75. 5. Current Business The **pizza fundraiser** brought in \$806. We did \$2800 in sales: \$1550 come back to us in credits. Jodi van der Meer and Annette Martin met with the school librarian to discuss how to use the credits to benefit the whole school. After they had used some of the credit, \$801 was left from last book fair, plus \$1200 from this time, so a total of \$2000 is available for Jodi van der Meer to allocate. Western Direct fundraiser: Custom printed forms to go out this week; will be due next Friday. We will get free shipping if more than 200 total items are ordered.

Spirit wear: The company we had been planning to use (run by a Dad from the school) is unable to match the prices we'd been quoted. We were considering going back to our previous supplier, but the customer service was poor. It was decided that we will pursue finding a new supplier and wait until the new year to send out order forms.

Julie de Boer is going to contact a different supplier and get prices.

Grade 5s are doing **Tupperware fundraiser** for Fort Steele field trip. Orders are due Friday, November 24.

Playground tables: Lisa Gyorkos presented the costs of composite tables for the playground from a company in New Westminster. Pricing for four tables (including freight) ranges from \$4000-\$5000. Money would come from the lunch account.

Jodi van der Meer is going to follow up with maintenance to make sure it's okay to put in tables and to look into the cost of concrete pads to place the tables on.

Snowshoes: The cost for snowshoes will be around \$70 for kids' pairs and \$150 for adult pairs. The options for purchasing them included MEC, Canadian Tire, Costco, and Skookum Cycle and Ski.

MOTION to spend \$2000 from the gaming account and \$1000 from the general account on snowshoes made by Lisa Gyorkos; seconded by Jessica Wright.

6. New Business

The PAC hosted a **movie day** at the Centennial theatre last year; it was suggested that we do it again, but this year we would need two days because we have more students at the school than last year.
