<u>Information Regarding Student</u> <u>Placement for 2019-2020</u>

Placement of students in classes is dependent upon a number of considerations. We will have our placement meeting in mid-June. Our school is likely going to have 17 divisions. As of now, we will have a combination of straight grades and mixed grades. Our class configurations may change with unexoected increased enrollment, so we

will have to wait until the first week of September to finalize classes. In placing students the following considerations are taken into account:

Behavioural/social issues
Diversity in development
(academic,social,emotional)

Middle Priority

Groupings in previous years
Dominant grade composition
Physical/social maturation
Learner style
Siblings and relations

Lower Priority

Friendships

Teacher-learner compatibility
Class size (room to accommodate new students)

The school staff will take every aspect into consideration when placing students from year to year. Notwithstanding, the opportunity is available for parents to meet with me to discuss placement for the coming year. The final decision regarding student placement rests with the school principal.
